

**PET LEVEL**

- **WORKSHEET : FIND SOMEONE WHO...**

This is a mingle activity “find someone who...” to talk about what students did over the summer. It practises forming questions and giving answers in the past tense. Look at the web worksheet together and make sure students understand the structures. Form the first question together to check your students can form a question in the past tense correctly.

For example: “If I want to find someone who went to the beach, what question can I ask?” ... “Did you go abroad this summer?” Write it on the board if necessary so students have a clear example of a question in the past. Students move around the class talking to different people, including the teacher, and noting down a name for each point. Point out that in one of the questions (Did you go to the beach?) They are looking for someone who will say “No”. Tell students that they must ask further questions to find out as much information as possible about their classmates. (Where did you go? Who did you travel with? Did you like it ? Why / Why not? Etc)

Feedback as a class briefly to hear about any interesting summer experiences.

For further practice, ask students to describe what they can see in the pictures, brainstorm vocabulary and write on the board any new vocabulary and useful expressions.
