ASK FOR SUGGESTIONS

'What shall we do ____?'
'Where shall we go ____?'

MAKE SUGGESTIONS

'How about going to ...?'
'Why don't we?'
'We could stay in'
'Let's invite some friends round to'.
Perhaps we should put ... first? What do you think?

A strong point in favour of ... is that ... What do you think should go next? Are you happy with this order then? Do you go along with that?

RESPOND TO SUGGESTIONS

'Yeah, that's a great idea'
'Yes, that sounds good'
'Well, I think I'd prefer to go ...'
